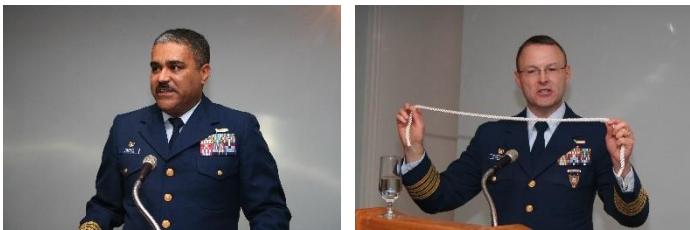

**5NR SPRING TRAINING CONFERENCE CANCELLED**

The Spring District 5NR DTRAIN has been cancelled. This decision had been considered thoroughly and was done in concert with other districts cancelling their DTRAINs as well. A considerable amount of the funding for our DTRAINs comes from the Coast Guard which would in all likelihood not be available if another government shutdown occurs, putting the Auxiliary 5NR District at risk for tens of thousands of dollars in expenses. As a District we simply can not afford to fund a DTRAIN on our own. In the event of another government shutdown, we would also have no participation in DTRAIN by any Active Duty personnel.

- By deciding to cancel the event now, there will be no penalty costs to the District. The hotel is graciously working with us but we had to make this decision immediately.
- Registration for the event has been closed—refunds are going out right away. We will return any funds that members have paid via check as soon as possible—processing of refunds will start over the weekend. Members need do nothing—we will alert you when the checks are processed.
- **IMPORTANT!** All those who have made hotel reservations need to call in and cancel their own reservations.
- We will have the Fall DTRAIN at the Crowne Plaza in Reading (Wyomissing) on 13, 14 and 15 September.

### ATLANTIC CITY BOAT SHOW

Planning has started for the Atlantic City Indoor Boat Show, 27 February to 3 March 2019. We are looking for volunteers to staff our booth. There will be 3 shifts each day. 11:00 AM - 2:30 PM, 2:30 PM – 6:00 PM and 6:00 PM – 8:00 PM Wednesday thru Friday. If you have not already created your Auxiliary Member Zone password you will need to do so before you can access the Core Training presentations, go to: [https://auxofficer.cgaux.org/auxoff/activate/new\\_password.php](https://auxofficer.cgaux.org/auxoff/activate/new_password.php) and create Your Auxiliary Member Zone Password.

This will get used many times throughout your Auxiliary career when access Member Only information on the Auxiliary websites.

You need to have your member ID to complete this request and use your primary email address to register.

Once you have created your Member Zone password, you can access the first six (6) CORE TRAINING requirements at:

Once you have completed the six (6) classes, you need to let your IS officer know so that information is entered into your training record.

### CHANGES TO AUXILIARY INCIDENT COMMAND SYSTEM (ICS) CORE TRAINING

16790 / AUX-PL-002(A) CG-BSX Policy Letter 19-02 issued on February 1, 2019

**TRAINING REQUIREMENTS.** In collaboration with CG Auxiliary Leadership and the Office of Contingency Preparedness & Exercise Policy (CG-CPE), the Office of Auxiliary & Boating Safety (CG-BSX) has determined that ICS-100 and IS-700 are no longer part of the initial Core Training (CT) package required for all Auxiliarists. The following are instituted immediately:

- a. The ICS-100 and IS-700 courses are required courses for all elected positions and for select competencies and select appointed positions listed in Enclosure (1), and Auxiliarists who are issued written orders.

(1) Competencies: The courses must be completed prior to obtaining a qualification listed in Enclosure (1). In effect, these course completions become required tasks for all listed competencies.

(2) Elected Positions: The courses must be completed prior to a nomination or notice of intent to run for any elected position.

(3) Appointed Positions: The courses must be completed prior to starting an appointed position listed in Enclosure (1).

(4) Written Orders<sup>1</sup>: The courses must be completed prior to issuance of written orders for any travel, assignment, or operational mission.

b. Required Yearly Not Met (REYR) Status: All Auxiliarists who are required to take ICS-100 and IS-700, must complete the courses or be placed in REYR Status for applicable competencies and/or positions. In addition, Auxiliarists shall neither request nor accept orders if these specific courses have not been completed unless waived by DIRAUX.

(1) An Auxiliarist who has a competency listed in Enclosure (1) and has not completed the courses will be placed in REYR Status within 90 days of this policy letter's promulgation date.

(2) In accordance with reference (c) and (d), all Auxiliarists currently in elected and/or appointed positions should have already completed Core Training which did include ICS-100 and IS-700 prior to the promulgation of this policy letter. Newly elected Auxiliarists and/or newly appointed Auxiliarists placed in to any of the positions in Enclosure (1) will have 90 days from the promulgation of this policy letter to complete the two courses or risk being placed in REYR status and potentially removed from the elected and/or appointed position.

(3) If an Auxiliarist, who is not holding an appointed position listed in Enclosure (1), or a competency listed in Enclosure (1), and is currently in REYR status solely because of not completing ICS-100 and/or IS-700 then the member will immediately be removed from REYR status and AUXDATA will indicate that AUXCT is complete.

(4) If an Auxiliarist is in REYR status solely because of not completing ICS-100 and/or IS-700 then the member's currency will immediately be restored upon successful completion of the courses.

c. ICS-100 and IS-700 will be removed from the AUXDATA CT list and eventually added to AUXDATA eligibility algorithms for all elected positions held, and for the listed competencies and appointed positions held.

d. Although all other Auxiliarists that do not hold a competency or position listed in Enclosure (1) or that are not issued written orders are not required to

complete ICS-100 and IS-700, they are encouraged to complete these courses for the purpose of professional development. These courses are available on the Auxiliary Learning Management System (AUX LMS).

### **RISK MANAGEMENT TRAINING REQUIREMENTS FOR THE COAST GUARD AUXILIARY**

16790 / AUX-PL-001(A) BSX Policy Letter 19-01 was issued on February 1, 2019

**TRAINING REQUIREMENTS.** In collaboration with Auxiliary Leadership, the Offices of Safety and Environmental Health (CG-113), Boat Forces (CG-731) and Shore Forces (CG-741), the Office of Auxiliary & Boating Safety (CG-BSX) has established the following RM training requirements for members of the Auxiliary. The following are instituted immediately:

a) RM/TCT Initial. The Introduction to Risk Management course (100202) is the initial RM/TCT requirement. This course is required for all elected positions and for select appointed positions and competencies listed in Enclosure (1). This course is available on AUXLMS. For those who may have difficulty accessing AUXLMS, the course can be taken in a classroom setting so long as the course is viewed in its entirety.

(1) Elected Positions: The course must be completed prior to a nomination or notice of intent to run for any elected position.

(2) Appointed Positions: The course must be completed prior to starting an appointed position.

(3) Competencies: The courses must be completed prior to becoming certified for a listed competency. In effect, these courses become required tasks for all listed competencies.

(4) All affected incumbent elected/appointed personnel and anyone currently certified in a competency listed in Enclosure (1) must complete the Introduction to Risk Management course by 30 April 2019.

b) TCT Refresher. This course is required for specified competencies listed in Enclosure (1). It must be completed as soon as possible after completion of the Introduction to Risk Management course and then annually, no later than the end of the 15th month following initial TCT or subsequent TCT Refresher training. Auxiliarists needing a TCT Refresher session may work with their OIA, AUXLO, and/or DIRAUX/OTO to request TCT Refresher training

using their district's process. Directors may grant waivers of TCT Refresher requirements if a lack of training availability will prevent a member from maintaining qualification. In such cases, the TCT Refresher must be completed as soon as possible.

c) CRM Initial. AUX Crew Resource Management (AUX-17) Course Code 501573. This course is the initial CRM training specified in references (a) and (b). All Auxiliary pilots, air crew, and observers must attend this C-school prior to certification in any Auxiliary aviation position. It must then be taken on a recurring basis with an interval not to exceed five calendar years. Auxiliarists who attended this course prior to January 1, 2017 have until the end of calendar year 2022 to complete their first recurrent attendance. Currently certified members who have never completed the course will have until 31 December 2019 to complete the course. Non-aviation Coast Guard and Auxiliary personnel who routinely use aviation assets to conduct missions are strongly encouraged to seek CRM training opportunities.

d) CRM Refresher. Must be completed annually, no later than the end of the 15th month following AUX-17 or subsequent CRM Refresher training. Must be completed by all pilots, air crew, and observers during the annual unit safety fly-in or other regional training event.

e) AUXAIR Spatial Disorientation/CRM (AUX-18). Spatial Disorientation/CRM (AUX-18) Course Code 501574: All Auxiliary pilots must attend a course on spatial disorientation and flight physiology on an initial and recurring basis. Initial attendance is required at the C-school provided by the FAA Civil Aerospace Medical Institute (CAMI) prior to certification in any Auxiliary pilot position. It must then be taken either at CAMI or at a commercially provided, Auxiliary-approved vendor on a recurring basis with an interval not to exceed five calendar years. Auxiliarists who attended this course prior to January 1, 2017 have until the end of calendar year 2022 to complete their first recurrent attendance. Currently certified pilots who have never completed this course will have until 31 December 2019 to complete the course.

f) Required Yearly Not Met (REYR) Status: All Auxiliarists who are required to take an initial and/or recurring risk management course must complete the course(s) or be placed in REYR Status for applicable competencies and/or positions. In addition, Auxiliarists shall neither request nor accept orders if these specific courses have not been completed.

g) AUXDATA Tracking. Introduction to Risk Management, TCT Refresher, CRM Initial and CRM

Refresher will be added as required tasks in AUXDATA for all competencies listed in Enclosure (1) as applicable and will eventually be added to AUXDATA eligibility algorithms for all elected positions which require the training. Completion of the Introduction to Risk Management course in AUXLMS will be automatically logged in the member's AUXDATA training record. Completion of AUX-17 and AUX-18 will be entered into AUXDATA using the current process. TCT Refresher and CRM Refresher, instructors/facilitators must send class attendance rosters to the respective IS officers for entry into AUXDATA. Course names and short titles for AUXDATA are listed in enclosure (2).

h) Instructor/Facilitator Requirements. The following are the requirements to be able to teach/facilitate initial and refresher RM training sessions.

(1) TCT Refresher. Must be delivered by a certified CG TCT Facilitator (AUXDATA Competency TCTFAC) or certified unit senior supervisory personnel per reference (a), section 14.d.2.c and 14.d.3. Members certified as Auxiliary TCT Facilitators (AUXDATA Competency TCTAUX) cannot currently deliver/facilitate the TCT Refresher per reference (a)1.

(2) CRM Initial. Only those instructors who have completed the Auxiliary CRM Initial training syllabus and are currently qualified by ATC Mobile to teach the course are authorized to teach CRM Initial (AUX-17) to Auxiliary personnel.

(3) CRM Refresher. Only those instructors who are currently qualified by ATC Mobile and have attended the Aviation Safety Standardization Course (500609) in conjunction with the Aux District Flight Safety course (AUX-14) within the previous two years are authorized to teach CRM Refresher to Auxiliary personnel.

i) All Coast Guard operations and activities expose personnel and equipment to some level of risk. Auxiliarists who do not hold a position or competency listed in Enclosure (1) are not required to complete risk management training, but they may complete these courses for the purpose of building and fostering a culture of safety and professionalism.

## **THE BASIC QUALIFICATION COURSE (BQC II)**

The second generation and completely new Basic Qualification Course (BQC II) is open to all CGAUX members. This course introduces the Auxiliary Manual in 7 bite size modules that can be taken in any order. After study and completing review questions, the



member goes to the National Testing Center (NTC) to take a 22-question exam. Passing this open book exam with 90% or better gives you AUXDATA credit immediately. To get started, go to:
